



Next-Generation DVDs

Electronics makers and computer companies are rushing to develop a new version of the DVD that can store higher-quality video, but they can't agree on the technology, so they've split into two camps. Sony, Panasonic, Apple and others support a standard called Blu-ray. Toshiba, Sanyo, Microsoft and others tout one called HD DVD. Until a few weeks ago, Blu-ray looked as if it would become the de facto standard, pushing HD DVD out of the market, says tech analyst Ste-

phen Baker with researcher NPD. Then Blu-ray supporter HP said it would back either standard. Now both might be released into the market to duke it out in a battle reminiscent of the VHS/Betamax war of the 1980, Baker says.

Some games just feel better when you play them using a gamepad rather than keyboard controls. Nyko's Air Flo Ex gives Mac users a comfortable gamepad option that performs well and most resembles the Sony PlayStation controllers. It's great for games such as Aspyr's Tony Hawk skateboarding series or for racing games if you don't have a racing wheel. Plug it into a USB port, and many games, such as Aspyr's Lego Star Wars (see review, page 59) recognize it immediately and let you use default settings or program the buttons. A Mac driver allows more detailed configurations. The airflow system of its namesake uses holes in the handles and really does keep them cool after prolonged use, unlike most other gamepads.

Ever been frustrated with Mail's simplistic new message count in its Dock icon? You get one number, representing only the messages in your inbox. But if you use rules to filter messages, you probably have unread mail in a number of folders, too. Enter DockStar. This Mail plug-in lets you view the unread count for up to five different mailboxes in Mail. I'm on a number of mailing lists, and I find this little tool is quite helpful for tracking new activity (in addition to my main inbox). The UI [User Interface] is quite intuitive, though I found the color-changing wheels to be somewhat tricky to use -- I'd love to see a pop-up for the standard color picker instead. But beyond that, it's well thought out, and you can even pick from a set of different graphics for each badge's background. 



Email Attachments Made Easy

If you want to attach a file to an email message, you can drag the file directly to Mail's icon in your Dock. This opens Mail and creates a brand-new email message window with that file already attached. Sweet! Better yet, even if you drag multiple attachments, they all attach to just one email message (rather than creating one message for each attachment, as in previous versions of Mac OS X).

How to Stop An Application from Launching

If you've accidentally launched an application that you didn't want to launch, you can stop that launch dead in its tracks by pressing **Command-Option-Shift-Escape**. (For those still on Panther, the shortcut is **Shift-Option-Command-Escape**).

DVD Screen Grab Tip

Here's how to take a screenshot from a DVD in Mac OS X Tiger.

1. Go to the part of the movie you'd like to capture. Hit the Stop button in the DVD controller.
2. Press the Play button in the controller, & then immediately press **Command-Shift-4**.
3. Hit the space bar to take a screenshot of the DVD Player window, then click the mouse to take the shot.

You can do all this without ever quitting DVD Player first.

A Method To Empty Trash That Refuses to Empty

Occasionally, I would find several items left in my trash that would not empty. Here's the cure: grab all the items in the trash, and drag them to the Desktop. Then return the icons to the trash, and empty the trash. The files are gone!

Prevent CD and DVD Disks from Becoming Stuck

There has been written a lot about one issue: CDs and DVDs have a tendency to get stuck in the drive at times. Most hints suggest a reboot for remedy. This was unacceptable to me.

After some research, I discovered that the disks only get stuck when the 'Put the disk(s) to sleep when possible' option is

activated in the Energy Saver settings. There is only one setting for all drives, so if you actually want your external disks to sleep, you are "stuck." But what if you could prevent your Superdrive from sleeping, and still have all other disks take their nap?

The solution: Employ

```
/usr/bin/drutil
```

via `launched`. You will only need TextEdit and Terminal to do the job, but you can use `Lingon` (<http://lingon.sourceforge.net/>) if you'd rather not use the command line.

Select Text Word-By-Word

This might be old hat to some, but I just discovered this behavior by accident (in both 10.3 and 10.4). If you double-click to select a whole word, and then hold the mouse button down, you can then drag to select contiguous words, one word at a time. This is similar to how Microsoft Word works. It seems to work in Safari, TextEdit, TextWrangler, Mail.app, Finder, etc.

A Timesaver When Using Safari in Offline Mode

A quickie but a goody. If you are using Safari to browse a previously-saved page such as `boingboing.net` while offline, here's a little timesaver. When you **Command-click** a bunch of links to new sites, they're not going to load -- because you have no active internet connection, obviously.

However, just keep all the "Failed to Open Page" pages/tabs open. Once you connect back up to the net, Safari realizes this, and goes ahead and grabs all the pages right away for you. Winner!

Google The Moon

Most of you have seen Google Earth that allows you to zoom around cities and countries like you were playing on a Xbox. But have you seen Google Moon (<http://moon.google.com/>)? It shows the NASA imagery related to the Apollo landings. But to see what the moon is really about zoom in all the way.

Email a Link and Page Name with One Click

Safari now emails links automatically. Go under the File menu to "Mail link to this page (**Command/Shift/I**)."

Spell Check in Stickies

Control/click the Stickies note and you get a dialog with that the choice to spell check. You can even select "Check Spelling As You Type."

Back Up Your Stickies

If you use Stickies a lot and don't want to lose any of the data, make a backup of the database. In OS 9, you can find it located in the System Folder, called Stickies. In OS X, open your Home/Library folder, and then **Option/drag** Stickies-

Database into a backup folder or disc. In case you somehow lose your information, the backup can be copied back to the appropriate location.

Page Set Up Tip

When accessing the Page Setup dialog, hold down the Option key when clicking the "OK" button to save the current settings as the default.

Improve Windows Media Playback for Free!

If you are having trouble with some streaming video content that uses Windows Media Player, there is a solution. I found that many sites using Windows Media streaming did not function well at all. Sometimes the video would be jerky, or take forever to start if it started at all. I found a solution that works well for me: Flip4Mac (<http://www.flip4mac.com/>). This program an add-in which allows you to use QuickTime to play digital media. It also enables a plug-in for Safari for web content media. The price varies, depending on what component you need (starting at \$29). There are educational discounts available (20% discount). As of January 2006, the basic Flip4Mac is now free.

Delete Mail Messages Without Using Mail's Trash

A message in Apple's Mail app can be permanently removed by cutting it (**Command-X**) instead of deleting it via any of the usual methods. This is a pretty basic hint, but when I'm clearing out mailboxes, it saves a trip to the Trash mailbox to delete them again.

Second Start Up Blink

Does your Mac's screen "blink" (or "flash") a second time at startup, just after the MacOS screen appears? Don't worry. It's normal. It means that the Mac is loading an updated version of the video driver software. If you really want to avoid the flash, hold down the **Command-Shift-N-D** keys at startup. Unfortunately, this also means you'll be using the older, presumably buggier, driver. Aside from being a bit irritating, the only problem this flash causes is that it wipes out any custom startup screen display.

Mac OS 9.x Scrapbook Resizing Tip

Hold down the **Command** key while resizing the Scrapbook window (by clicking and holding and dragging on the bottom right corner) to make it smaller than would otherwise be possible.

A Typing Tutor

If you're looking for a typing tutor program that works with any version of Mac OS X, Key Advantage Typing is worth a try. This program is great for the novice typist or if you're just looking to improve your typing skills because it's customized. There are 25 lessons "easy-to-follow" lessons and using the 30 free trial version, you are able to try the first 5 lessons. You can download the free trial version from <http://www.programmingart.com/products/key/>. The full program cost is \$19.95. By the way, a free trial version is also available for Mac OS 9 and Windows users.
